We were initially advised that the report would be completed by December 2nd; however, this was later extended to the end of January. We are currently awaiting confirmation from HR on the final timeline.

On a national level, our union is actively addressing critical industry challenges. Lana Payne, our National President, recently held a forum with hundreds of local union presidents across the country to discuss the pressing threat of tariffs and Unifor's Canada-first approach to protecting jobs and safeguarding our economy. If imposed, these tariffs would significantly impact the aerospace sector, which relies heavily on an integrated supply chain with the U.S.

To address this, we have scheduled meetings with Bombardier to understand their concerns and explore ways we can assist. Additionally, we have reached out to both De Havilland and MDA Space to offer our support in navigating these challenges. Our collective strength lies in our ability to take proactive measures, engage in meaningful dialogue, and advocate fiercely for the interests of our members and the broader industry.

Thank you all for your unwavering dedication and support. Let's continue to stand together, strengthen our union, and work towards a future where every member is valued, protected, and empowered.
