There were reports from many Regional OHC Councils so many reporting Hospital and Emergency closures in their areas. Waiting list for doctors, even in the GTA area. This is a horrific situation brought on by the actions of the Ford Government.

The OHC is nonpartisan and as such there were presentations by Bonnie Crombie (Lib) Mike Schreiner (Green Party) Marit Stiles (NDP and Dr Adil Shamji (Lib Health Critic). There were excellent sessions, discussions and debates on the fightback against for-profit privatization of hospitals and healthcare and lessons learned. A briefing on what are the key health care issues and Ford's messaging. Conclusion Ford is expert at messaging and taking the focus off himself and putting it on Trump. We must change that.
